Data columns. iC, based on 2-letter FIPS code. Name, of the province, as generally given by the country. Population, from the national census after but nearest 2010, and figures are rounded to nearest tenth of a million. %C, percent Christian, of all traditions, based on Operation World, World Christian Database, and national researchers. Peoples: the generally largest unreached groups within the area. Due to the extreme space limitations, this is intended as representative, to give a sense of the diversity of the task; individual provinces have vastly more peoples than those noted here.

Methodology. The original definition of *unreached* did not have any statistical measure. One way many “measure” unreached-ness is less than 5% Christian (of any tradition) and/or less than 2% Evangelical. In this list, we simply use “less than 5% Christian” because we don’t reliably have the % Evangelical for every province in the world.

In all, there are 825 provinces estimated to be less than 5% Christian. Over 2.7 billion people, or nearly a third of the world’s total population, live in these 825. About 1.9 billion people live in just 40 of these provinces, each having more than 10 million in population. These 40 provinces are home to 1.87 billion non-Christians, or just shy of 40% of all non-Christians in the world (that is, those who would confess to being something other than Christian—Muslims, Hindus, Buddhists, etc).

There are two ways to make the world vastly “more Christian” (e.g. to increase the % Christian of the world): tackling over 750 provinces with smaller populations, or making a difference in these 40. An additional benefit to the latter: these 40 are very influential: making a difference here would have a significant spillover effect.
